I want to tell you a Christmas story about nanny Maria and her brother Celedonio. It's a story about a grown man who had no family for twenty years, and found one at our orphanage.

Destitute and desperate

Maria has been caring for the children at the orphanage for over a decade. When she first came to the orphanage she had no home, no job and three young daughters. She was separated from her husband, destitute and desperate. Getting a job at the orphanage was a tremendous blessing for Maria. It provided shelter for her and her children, as well as income, food and clothing. Her daughters were enrolled at the nearest school.

Maria has a true heart for children. God has gifted her with a special love. She has been a tremendous blessing to our home. For many years Maria worked in the nursery, caring for the babies. When new infants arrived, Maria would bring them into her room to calm them and help them sleep at night. Maria cherished mothering

In Mexico the name for our orphanage is "Hogar Para Niños Necessitados del Sauzal", meaning home for needy children of El Sauzal. El Sauzal Orphanage is a loving home and family for hurt

them. She treasured being in the nursery and worked there until it was too difficult due to health issues.

"I feel part of a family"

A few years ago Maria had a serious health scare. Her doctors were concerned that she had cancer, so Maria underwent surgery a few days before Christmas. The procedure made it difficult to fulfill her duties; at the time she was the cook. Every year the orphanage celebrates on Christmas Eve with a special feast. They typically make six hundred tamales – chicken, beef and sweet tamales. They are time-consuming to prepare. After Maria's surgery, the teens helped prepare the tamales. They insisted on Maria taking it easy.

That Christmas, Maria's brother Celedonio was visiting from Los Angeles. Maria and Celedonio had been estranged for many years. They had lost contact and fallen apart until Celedonio found Maria online. He came to the orphanage to be with Maria after her surgery, very concerned for her health.

As the teens made the tamales Celedonio worked with them. Seeing their support for Maria made him emotional. He was moved to see the kids helping her; he saw how they had become a family to Maria and her daughters. He told Maria, "I forgot for twenty years [*what it was like to have a family*]. I didn't know anything about my family. But now with you I feel part of a family [*here at the orphanage*]." Since that Christmas Celedonio has visited several times to prepare special carne asada meals for his new orphanage family.
