Sparking a new vision

After years of bringing high school students to serve at the El Sauzal Orphanage, we have formed many wonderful and loving relationships. Yet, we still have a desire for these connections to grow deeper than ever before. This is what sparked a new idea to draw our group closer to the orphanage and all of us nearer to God.

Spanish + English = a great idea

Last year our group invited the youth from the orphanage and the community to join us each night for devotions. We sent the lessons ahead of time to a wonderful young lady named Yessica. She worked hard translating each devotion into Spanish. Then, while we were there, Yessica came every night and interpreted our discussions. This was such a special opportunity.

Each evening we would begin by singing songs that we knew in English and the Mexicans knew in Spanish. As the room filled with the sound of praises being sung in both languages at the same time, the presence of the Holy Spirit was overwhelming. By the end of our two-week stay, we totaled about thirty people from our group, the community and the orphanage crowded into the little common room in the dorms. After this trip we could not imagine going back to doing our devotions without the teens from the orphanage and community. We decided

the joint devotions would be something we would do for all the years to come.

Taking it even further

This year we determined to take it even further. We wanted to learn what it means to serve God together as the family of God. In addition to completing work projects around the orphanage, we also focused on serving the community. We assisted the local church, two families, and another orphanage for children who have special needs. For each

of these projects we gathered with our students from the U.S., the orphanage, and many from San Antonio de las Minas. We loaded into every vehicle we could find and went together to lend a hand. This was so special for each of us. We were reminded that no matter where we are from, what background we have, where we live, or what our own hardships are, there is always someone else to whom we can show Christ's love through service.

Connecting on a deep spiritual level

After our work projects we came together each night for devotions. With Yessica translating, we would discuss "why we serve". Following the devotions, we split up into small groups that were a mix of Mexican and U.S. youth. This provided us with the opportunity to connect on a deep spiritual level.

A large extended family

It was amazing to watch God work as both cultures shared their common struggles, joys, love and devotion for Christ. We were reminded that there is one God and one Church. There was a deeper sense of awareness that we have family and friends throughout the world that we can count on to pray for us and encourage us in our walk with the Lord. If one person is struggling, they know and trust that their brothers and sisters across the border are praying for them, loving them and supporting them. We are one large extended family; even more so, we are one family in Christ. We see and believe that we serve ONE God and that we serve others together as one Church!

It's time to update your contacts! The mailing address of El Sauzal Foundation has changed to:


